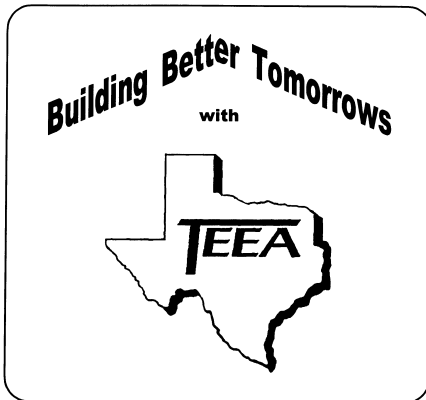

History of the TEEA

Milam County Extension Education Clubs are part of a statewide organization, Texas Extension Education Association, Inc. (TEEA). The Extension Education Association Club Program in Texas has undergone several name changes throughout the years.

In 1912, Mrs. Edna Trigg was appointed as the first Texas Home Demonstration Agent in Milam County. She first worked with farm girls, and later with their mothers, teaching them how to grow, prepare and can tomatoes. By 1914 and 1915 Tomato Clubs were organized and by 1917 Home Demonstration Clubs were holding regular meetings. The first Association meetings were reported in 1924. Home Demonstration Clubs changed names as follows:

- Extension Homemakers Clubs - in 1979
- Family and Community Education Clubs - in 1993
- Extension Education Association Clubs - in 2000.
